1 An act to allow State Parks to charge an entry feel to any and all persons/vehicles entering the park.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: A plan to allow State Parks to charge a small fee to people visiting the park as a way to
6 increase the revenue of the park. The continual deterioration of the park is also resulting in business
7 moving out of the park, which leads to a major decrease in the already small Park budget. The State
8 Parks would charge a small fee of \$3 per person or \$5 per car, however 15 person vans or larger will
9 cost \$10.

11 Section 2: The visitors fee would be a small amount relating to the average annual attendance and the
12 cost of maintaining the park. It is estimated that \$240 million is needed to maintain the 50 State Parks
13 over the next 6-year budget cycle that starts in 2016. The park system is a major contributor to the
14 wealth of Kentucky and their deterioration has a major impact of the state finances as a whole.
