An act to fix the flaws of the Cannabidiol (CBD) Oil Legislation

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: This bill will expand the current law that Beshear passed in 2014 that legalized CBD OIL possession for those with Epilepsy to but didn't establish a production and distribution program. This bill will help Kentucky residents struggling with Epilepsy, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), and any other conditions. It will generate jobs at dispensary, and put people back to work and off medical leave.

Section 2: This bill will associate with all people affected by a neurological disorder marked by sudden recurrent episodes of sensory disturbance, loss of consciousness, or convulsions, associated with abnormal electrical activity in the brain called Epilepsy.

Section 3: The effectiveness of this bill will be placed on state issued sticker on license (if approved by physician) to be registered on existing state database list so that the state can keep track of who can acquire the dispensary and possess CBD oil. (Sticker would be specifically created and issued by the state of a high security tamper evident security hologram sequentially numbered type labels and sent to the Circuit Court Clerk's offices and issued upon verification of names on database list as a tracking and dispensing verification.)

Section 4: In order to successfully go through with this bill, a way has been determined. We will host monthly fund-raisers throughout the state to help people that Epilepsy has had an impact on. We will host fund-raisers such as a 5K run, car washes, raffles and many more along with any and all donations from events such as sports games and restaurants.

Section 5: This bill will go into effect approximately on January 1st 2018.
