1                   An act to provide incentives for AP exams in the form of KEES money to all students  
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3                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**  
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5 Section 1: The KEES program currently gives a range of \$200-300 for AP scores of three or higher to  
6 students who qualify for free or reduced lunches. This is an incentive to motivate kids to take these  
7 higher education classes and stay in Kentucky for college.  
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9 Section 2: Students who qualify for free or reduced lunches currently receive \$200 for scoring a 3, \$250  
10 for a 4, and \$300 for a 5 on any AP test. This would be altered to be provided for all students who score  
11 a three or higher. To prevent overspending, the scale would change to \$100 for a 3, \$150 for a 4, and  
12 \$200 for a 5 on any AP test.

14 Section 3: Currently Arizona, California, and Massachusetts provide scholarship incentives for achieving  
15 certain AP scores.  
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17 Section 4: This extra incentive would motivate all students to try harder in AP classes, because they can  
18 receive extra money for getting a higher score, and to take the class in the first place. This would also  
19 make students more likely to choose colleges in-state, keeping higher educated students in Kentucky.  
20 Taking AP courses in high school, would also be cheaper than taking the class in college, which would  
21 lead to less debt after college.  
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23 Section 5: The KEES program is 100% sponsored by the Kentucky Lottery.  
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25 Section 6: This Bill will go into effect the school year following passage. Any student that scored a three  
26 or higher on an AP exam before this bill is enacted will not receive the incentive.
