1 An act to require all Schools in the Commonwealth to have Sanitary Bottle Filling Stations.

2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This bill will provide students with a sanitary, purified water source. Providing the water
6 stations will not only help with the decrease of various diseases caused through water fountains, but will
7 also help with the recycling of water bottles.

8
9 Section 2: This bill pertains to all educational facilities in the Commonwealth.

10
11 Section 3: The costs for each station will range between \$189-1,500, depending on the size of the unit
12 to be installed.

13
14 Section 4: To help offset costs, grant money provided by the Commonwealth's Department for
15 Environmental Protection will be made available.

16
17 Section 5: Guidelines will be established by the Energy and Environmental Cabinet during the 2017
18 Assembly.

19
20 Section 6: Once grant applications have been received and schools are notified of the amount of
21 assistance awarded, they can begin the installations of the stations.

22
23 Section 7: All facilities must have at least one station installed and prepared to be utilized by Aug. 2018.
24 If not, the facility could face a possible fine to be determined by the Energy and Environmental Cabinet of
25 Kentucky.
