1 An act to legalize prostitution in Kentucky

2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

4
5 Section 1: This bill shall legalize the act of prostitution, repealing KRS 529.020.

6
7 Section 2: Prostitutes shall be defined as adults (18 years and above) who consensually exchange sex
8 and sexual activity for profit as members of a state-supervised business organization.

10 Section 3: Prostitution shall be subject to monthly, random state health and safety regulations from the
11 health department.

13 Section 4: All funds previously designated to the prosecution and prevention of prostitution in state and
14 local police budgets shall be redistributed into the prosecution and prevention of human trafficking, as
15 well as into maintaining monthly random regulation of prostitution.

17 Section 5: Failure to meet the requirements of the state including the health department and police will
18 result in the loss of a license to practice prostitution and a fine of \$500.

19
20 Section 6: A tax of 15% will be placed upon these businesses' yearly income, with 50% of prostitution-
21 generated state revenue funding the prevention of human trafficking.

23 Section 7: This bill will go into effect January 1st, 2018
