- 1 An act to allow Peace Officers of Kentucky to be protected under the hate crimes statute.
- 2
- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: This bill would allow Peace Officers of city, county, and state jurisdictions to be protected
- 6 under Kentucky’s hate crime laws. Peace officers would be added to the list of requirements for a crime
- 7 to be classified as a hate crime under KRS 532.031, that then a judge can consider sentencing.
- 8
- 9 Section 2: This bill pertains to all KY citizens.
- 10
- 11 Section 3: At the next Kentucky General Assembly on January 3, 2017 Kentucky senators and
- 12 representatives will rewrite and ratify the wording of KRS 532.031 to include peace officers.
- 13
- 14 Section 4: This bill would not require any funding.
- 15
- 16 Section 5: There will be no penalty for this bill.
- 17
- 18 Section 6: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2018.
