An act to regulate Kentucky Public High School's Artificial Turf Fields.

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Diseases are spread through skin to skin contact and contact with infected blood, sweat, and other bodily fluids. Some can be deadly.

Section 2: A turf burn is caused by falling or sliding on artificially turf, which then leads to an abrasion on the skin. Due to the open wound, players that sustain turf burns have a risk of infection seven times higher than a player who did not sustain a turf burn.

Section 3: There are many benefits of cleaning the fields monthly. Examples are having a decreased chance of getting and spreading infection, having healthier athletes, and having a healthier school.

Section 4: The school administration must disinfect the turf fields monthly using the method of UVC light. The school may choose the brand and supplier. A KHSAA officer will annually and randomly inspect the school's fields. The school must also show documentation of the monthly sanitation having occurred. A five-hundred dollar fine will be put on the school by the state for every month the school does not comply to the rules and regulations set by this bill.

Section 5: The funding for this bill will come from the school's athletic department.

Section 6: The regulations in this bill will become effective one year after made law.
