- 1 An act to remove luxury taxes from feminine hygiene products
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- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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- 5 Section 1: Currently in Kentucky there is a 6% sales tax on all 'non-luxury' tangible personal property
- 6 but there are exceptions for necessities like food, and prescription medical products. However there is
- 7 a tax on feminine hygiene products because they are considered luxury.
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- 9 Section 2: There won't be extra financial obligation for the state of Kentucky because the feminine
- 10 hygiene products will be added to the exemptions from taxes of medical products.

- 12 Section 3: Luxury tax on feminine hygiene products violates the equal protection clause in the
- 13 constitution because tax on feminine products means taxes only targeted at absolute necessities for
- 14 woman.

- 16 Section 4: This bill will go into effect on January 1st 2017
