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1 An act to universalize Kentucky's grading scale and how grades are weighted throughout Kentucky's
2 public high schools.

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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6 Section 1: Throughout all high school classrooms, tests are to be worth forty-percent of a student's
7 grade.

9 Section 2: Throughout all high school classrooms, classwork is to be worth thirty-percent of a
10 student's grade.
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12 Section 3: Throughout all high school classrooms, homework is to be worth thirty-percent of a
13 student's grade, or, at the discretion of the teacher, a quiz section may be added.
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15 Section 4: If a quiz section is added, quiz grades throughout all high school classrooms are to be worth
16 ten-percent of a student's grade, and homework is to be worth twenty-percent of the student's grade.
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18 Section 5: Judgment of what defines homework, classwork, test, and quiz grades will be the teacher's
19 responsibility in relation to the subject being taught.

21 Section 6: In addition to this, the grading scale is to be normalized throughout Kentucky high schools
22 using this format; an "F" would be given if below sixty-four percent average, a "D" would be given from
23 sixty-four percent to sixty-nine percent average, a "C" would be given from seventy to eighty-one
24 percent average, a "B" would be given from eighty-two to ninety-one percent average, and finally an
25 "A" would be given from ninety-two to one-hundred percent average.
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27 Section 7: This bill will be at no cost to the state, and shall be enforced by the Kentucky Department of
28 Education.
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30 Section 8: If passed, this bill will be put into effect as of January 1, 2018.
