1 An act to allow Kentucky high school students to gain career readiness status in the areas of vocal and  
2 instrumental music.  
3

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

6 Section 1: In the state of Kentucky, there are currently over 200 pathways that qualify students to be  
7 career ready as defined by the Kentucky Department of Education. However, vocal and instrumental  
8 music is not recognized by the state.  
9

10 Section 2: Career readiness would be determined by achievement of Kentucky state regulations.  
11 Students would be eligible to take an assessment upon the completion of six trimesters or four  
12 semesters of music education courses. This assessment would cover music curriculum mandated by  
13 the state of Kentucky. Excellence on this assessment would be defined by a score of 70% or higher.  
14

15 Section 3: These assessments will be funded through federal Carl D. Perkins funds and will be  
16 administered by the Kentucky Department of Education Office of Career and Technical Education.

18 Section 4: This bill will go into effect the summer of 2017 and the first assessment will be given in May  
19 2020.
