1 An act to modify university and college policies on the reporting of sexual assault.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: The purpose of the proposed bill is to enforce policies in Colleges or Universities to require
6 the reporting of all sexual assault cases to authorities once reported to the scholarly institution.
7 Colleges or Universities involved must take action against the assaulter if officially found guilty.

9 Section 2: This act will protect victims and countless others from assault in the future; It also ensures
10 some sort of justice for the victims that reported their assault. If assaulter is proven guilty, the adult in
11 question shall be expelled from the institution. If actions are being taken for these terrible crimes,
12 others may come forward about their experiences and the University or College can get a better grip on
13 preventing and reporting sexual assaults on campus.

15 Section 3: Failure to report the assault and/or take action on the assaulter if found guilty, will result in
16 fining of the University or College in question. Fines start at \$10,000 and reach up to \$50,000
17 depending on the severity, specific case, or if the institution is a repeating offender. If a University or
18 College has 10 or more unreported instances of sexual assault on campus, they lose their
19 accreditation.

21 Section 4: This will be enacted June 26, 2017.
