1 An act to require psychological background checks for all purchasers of firearms in Kentucky.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Prior to the purchase of the firearm in the state of Kentucky, citizens must complete a past
6 the mental health screening by licensed physician.

7
8 Section 2: Kentucky citizens purchasing a fire arm must submit documentation of results of the mental
9 health screening to the seller/retailer prior to purchase.

10
11 Section 3: Buyers to purchase a firearm without providing signed documentation of results of the
12 mental health screening from a licensed physician are subject to: a) A \$500 dollars fine for a first
13 offense b) 2 to 5 years in prison for two or more offenses and weapons purchased will be revoked.

15 Section 4: Sellers of firearms or negligent in obtaining sign documentation of results of the mental
16 health screening from a licensed physician are subject to: a) \$500 fine for a first offense b) 2 to 5
17 years in prison for two or more offenses and the closing of their business.

18
19 Section 5: Guidelines outlined in Sections 3 and 4 are at the discretion of the courts and jurisdiction of
20 the offender.

21
22 Section 6: Sections #2 and #3 apply to both public and private firearms transactions.

23
24 Section 7: All fines collected will be donated to support charitable organizations to help the victims of
25 gun violence.

27 Section 8: Following a first-time conviction, the names of purchasers/sellers will be entered into a
28 statewide database accessible to all law enforcement agencies in Kentucky.
