Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

An act to reward blood donors in Kentucky with a charitable contribution tax credit.

Section 1: As taken from the American Red Cross website, "Although an estimated 38 percent of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood at any given time, less than 10% of that eligible population actually do each year. Every two seconds someone in the U.S. needs blood." Giving incentives to those who give blood could increase donors. This incentive could provide a noticeable increase in donors and could help solve the problem of a lack of blood in the state of Kentucky.

Section 2: This proposal would allow anyone who donates blood to receive charitable contribution tax credits toward their Kentucky state taxes.

Section 3: People are able to donate one pint of blood every two months. Every time a person donates, they will receive a \$100 tax credit toward charitable contributions. The Blood Center (eg. Red Cross) would issue them a charitable contribution receipt stating their donation and the \$100 charitable contribution tax credit.

Section 4: This bill would not cost the government or the people anything since these are just charitable contribution deductions.

Section 5: There would be no penalty needed as these are voluntary contributions and donors may choose whether or not to claim the charitable contributions deductions on their taxes.

Section 6: This bill will go into effect immediately upon passage
