An act to increase the state tax on cigarette sales in Kentucky.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Currently, the state cigarette tax in Kentucky is sixty (60) cents. This bill proposes an increase of forty (40) cents, resulting in a dollar tax.

Section 2: The expected revenue per year will be approximately 30 million dollars.

Section 3: The revenue from this tax will go to the state government and towards state-funded college scholarships, such as KEES.
