An act to renew hands-on first aid training for teachers each year.

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Teachers will be given a hands-on course covering CPR, Heimlich maneuver, and how to use an epi-pen each year.

Section 2: Schools that do not comply with this law will at first be given a warning, and if they still do not comply, they will be fined \$500 dollars the first time, \$1,000 the second time, and on the third offense a government official will come and administrate training and they will also be feed \$1500. If schools can not afford to administer training, they will be given three months to collect enough money. If it is a government owned school, it will be given free training. If it is an independent school district, it will be shut down until all officials have been given training.

Section 3: This bill will cost schools the price of dummies to practice these skills and the price of a practice epi-pen, if they comply. Their school nurse can give these lessons if they are qualified. This bill will give teachers as many hours as they spend training in the same amount of professional development hours.

Section 4: This bill will cost about 95 dollars per CPR doll and 6 dollars per practice epi pen.

Section 5: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2017
