1 An Act to Abolish the Disciplinary Use of Corporal Punishment in Kentucky Institutions
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: Currently, Kentucky is one of nineteen states that allows corporal punishment. Corporal
6 punishment is the use of physical force by an adult on a minor or mentally disabled person for
7 disciplinary matters. This bill will revoke current Kentucky Revised Statute 503.110, which allows the
8 use of corporal punishment.
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10 Section 2: An institution is a school or facility including, but not limited to, hospitals and facilities for
11 the mentally disabled.

13 Section 3: Any person who fails to comply with this bill will be charged with a misdemeanor and
14 punished accordingly:
15 • First offense - one month suspension without pay
16 • Second offense - fired from the current institution
17 • Third offense - no longer allowed to be hired by an institution in the Commonwealth
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19 Section 4: Schools will be required to report offenses to their local school board and each board will
20 submit offense records to the Department of Education. All other institutions will report incidents to
21 the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services, which currently oversees the abuse registry.

23 Section 5: This bill will go into effect August 1, 2017.
