1 An act to grant identification cards to homeless people of Kentucky.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This bill will grant homeless people the option to easily obtain a Kentucky state approved
6 identification card.

8 Section 2: In order to put this bill into place, the government would issue identification vouchers to homeless
9 shelters and facilities. The director of the facility or shelter must also supply a letter proving the person's
10 homelessness.

12 Section 3: The homeless person would take their voucher and letter to one of the county clerk offices to
13 receive an identification card. They will also need to present one document proving their age and identity
14 and a valid Social Security Number. If the person is unable to supply these requested documents, the
15 Department of Motor Vehicles will look at other documents in their possession and assist in verifying the
16 person's identity.

18 Section 4: Identification cards cost \$12 each. The Department of Motor Vehicles will provide \$10,000
19 annually to fund this bill. After 5 years this amount would be amended to accommodate the remaining
20 homeless people without identification cards.

22 Section 5: Upon passage, this bill will go into effect on January 1 the year after it is passed.
