1 An act to provide an increase in tax credit for food donations to food kitchens and/or homeless shelters.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

5 Section 1: Food donors will be provided a tax credit of 20%, instead of the current 10% provided in
6 KRS 141.392

7

8 Section 2: The USDA will determine fair market price for donated edible food products.

10 Section 3: The donations must be made to a registered organization/foundation approved by the Better
11 Business Bureau and the IRS (Internal Revenue Service).

13 Section 4: The IRS will determine the non-refundable tax credit for food donations.

14

15 Section 5: All donors must have proof of receipt to qualify for the tax credit.

16

17 Section 6: Donors may be eligible for tax credit twice a year.

18

19 Section 7: This bill will go into effect one year after passage.
