1 An act to require background checks and registration for all gun purchases

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: All gun purchases, both private and public, within the state of Kentucky will require a background
6 check and registration for the purchaser.

7
8 Section 2: The cost of the background checks and necessary paperwork for registration will be included in
9 the fee to register and attached to the bill of sale. The cost of additional enforcement will be covered in part
10 by a .2% sales tax on all guns and ammunition.

12 Section 3: The Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco Firearms and Explosives will be responsible for enforcement of this
13 law. The background check will be implemented by The National Instant Criminal Background Check System.

15 Section 4: Punishment will include possible fines and/or jail time for the purchaser and will be determined
16 based on the type of gun purchased. Sellers not abiding by the law will face potential fines and/or jail time. If
17 a problem persists, the license to sell will be revoked. Any incurred fines collected will be used to pay for the
18 additional expenses of enforcement.

20 Section 5: All past or current laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill shall be hereby considered null and
21 void.

23 Section 6: This bill will go into effect thirty (30) days following passage. Sellers will have six (6) months after
24 the initial thirty (30) days for complete compliance.
