- 1 An act to require a fire extinguisher in every schools' classrooms and offices within the state of Kentucky.

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: By placing fire extinguishers in every classroom and office, it will ensure student and faculty
- 6 safety from fires and intruders.
- 7
- 8 Section 2: This bill will require that every school put one fire extinguisher in every classroom and school
- 9 office. If a school does not comply, they will be responsible for covering the cost of each fire extinguisher.
- 10
- 11 Section 3: The cost of the this bill is relatively inexpensive. The cost that each school district would incur
- 12 would be on average \$400 per school within their district and around \$25, for a 10lb. extinguisher if it
- 13 needed to be refilled.

- 15 Section 4: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2015.
