



Voter Registration & Education in Kentucky

How can you get engaged?

1. Host a Voter Registration Drive at Your School

- a. **Classroom presentations**— Schedule and lead 15-30 minutes classroom presentations where eligible seniors and juniors can register and learn about Kentucky voter laws.
 - i. **Best Practices:** Think about a class that ALL seniors must take, like social studies or homeroom. Try to work with the teachers in to organize all classroom presentations to occur in one week.
- b. **Library Drive**— Set-up a voter registration station in your library, then have teachers bring their classes to you at assigned times throughout the day.
 - i. If your library has computers, even better, do online voter registration: www.inspire-usa.org/register
- c. **Senior Assemblies**— Work with your principal to hold a school-wide drive, and present to your full senior and junior classes
 - i. **Best Practices:** Staple the pledge to vote cards onto the voter registrations forms and hand them out to EVERY student as they walk into the assembly. Be organized and make sure you check every voter reg form as students turn them into you.
- d. **Online/Text voter registration event**— Plan and promote a digital voter drive, where students are encouraged to text-to-register or online register on the same day.
 - i. **Best Practices:** Present to a captive audience and walk them through the online voter registration form.

To get started:

1. Register your HS school via Inspire KY: [REGISTER HERE TO HOLD A DRIVE](#)
2. Once registered, you'll get a next steps email from KY YMCA Program Coordinator Mariama Lockington (mariama@kymca.org). She will help you plan, implement, and track your drive.
3. Pro tip: Make sure you're registering your HS with Inspire U.S. at least 2 weeks before you want to hold your drive, so we have time to get you all your materials!

2. Apply for the Georgia Davis Powers Award

Did you hold a voter drive and get 75-100% of eligible junior and seniors registered or pledged to vote? You may qualify for the [Georgia Davis Powers Award](#) and a visit from Kentucky's Secretary of State, Alison Grimes. This award is given to high schools with outstanding effort to register students to vote. Schools are awarded one of three award tiers and you will be recognized for your leadership in this effort by the Secretary of State:

- Gold Award: 100% of eligible students registered to vote
- Silver Award: 90% of eligible students registered to vote
- Bronze Award: 75% of eligible students registered to vote

3. Get registered students to "Plan to Vote".

General Election is November 6, 2018- your vote counts! Now that you've registered students at your school to vote, we need to help them be informed and prepared VOTERS- help them Make a Plan to Vote.

IMPORTANT DATES & DEADLINES FOR KENTUCKY VOTERS

- **September 25, 2018-** National Voter Registration Day!
- **October 9, 2018**— Last day to register to be eligible to vote in the General Election
 - **November 6, 2018**— General Election Day, polls open 6am-6pm
- **March 2019**—Georgia Davis Powers Award Application Due, exact date TBD

FAQs

How old do I need to be to register to vote?

If you will be 18 yrs old by November 6, 2018, you are eligible to register to vote now.
